



HOW TO ENROL INTO A COURSE AT THE MACKAY ENGINEERING COLLEGE

AVAILABLE COURSES:

- Cert II in Electro-technology (Career Start) – 18 months
 - Students start this course at the beginning of Year 11 and finish mid Year 12
- Cert II in Automotive Vocational Preparation – 12 months
 - Students start this course at the beginning of Year 11 or Year 12
- Cert II in Engineering Pathways – 2 years
 - Students start this course at the beginning of Year 11 and continue until the end of Year 12.

The enrolment process usually forms part of the SET plan process in Year 10. (check with your school)

PREREQUISITE: Students must be an enrolled at one of the following six high schools

- Mackay State High School
- Mackay North State High School
- Mackay Northern Beaches State High School
- Mirani State High School
- Pioneer State High School
- Sarina State High School

If students are not enrolled at one of the schools listed above they cannot attend the MEC.

Students who meet the prerequisite above and who want to enrol must:

- Complete a MEC application to enrol form in conjunction with a parent/caregiver. Applications are available from your school MEC co-ordinator.
- Supply 3 forms of ID in colour copy submitted with application form. (requirements can be found with application pack)
- Must have a USI (Unique Student Identifier) and LUI (Learner Unique Identification) – write the USI and LUI on the application form. Instructions on how to obtain a USI are on the front page of the application form and the school will supply the LUI.
- Submit their completed pack and coloured ID to your school MEC co-ordinator.

SELECTION PROCESS

Each school selects/approves students who may enrol at the MEC. Students will be notified by their school MEC Co-ordinator if they have been accepted. The MEC will email successful students and their parent/caregiver with further information on how they complete their enrolment process.

The schools determine suitable candidates to attend the MEC.

The Mackay Engineering College does not make the decision on whether or not students can attend the MEC.
